

**Lesson Title:** Road Rules for Preschoolers

**Age Group:** 3-5 years

**Duration:** 45 minutes

**Focus Keyword:** Road Safety Rules for Preschoolers

**Objective:**

Upon completion of this lesson, preschoolers can:

1. Recognize simple road safety rules.
2. Understand how traffic lights and pedestrian safety matter.
3. Recognize safe habits to follow when walking on roads.

**Essential Materials for Road Safety Lesson**

- Toy traffic signs (Stop, Go, Pedestrian Crossing, Traffic Light, etc.)
- Red, yellow, and green craft paper or toy traffic light
- Small toy cars and road mats
- Storybook on road safety (if available)
- Printable road safety colouring sheets

**Lesson Plan to Teach Road Safety**

**Introduction (10 minutes) - Knowing Traffic Lights**

- Start by asking: "Who has ever seen traffic lights before? What are they for?"
- Show pictures or a model traffic light to illustrate the three colours:
  - Red = Stop
  - Yellow = Slow Down
  - Green = Go
- Tell why following these lights is important to stay safe.

**Interactive Story Time (10 minutes) - Road Safety in Action**

- Read a short story or show a video on road safety.
- Ask: "What should we do before crossing the road?"

**Hands-On Activity (15 minutes) - Road Safety Fun Games**

- Traffic Light Game:
  - Get red, yellow, and green craft paper.

- Demonstrate different colours and ask children to respond according to that (stop, slow down, go).
- Pedestrian Practice:
  - Make a mini road with tape and toy cars.
  - Request children to practice crossing at a "zebra crossing" by looking left and right.

#### **Reinforcement & Discussion (5 minutes) - Reminder about Road Safety Rules**

- Show all the different road signs and query children on what they are.
- Talk to them about walking alongside an adult hand when they are near the road.
- Request the children to retell the information they've received.

#### **Wrap-Up Activity (5 minutes) - Engaging Road Safety Activity**

- Offer each child a road safety colour page to work on at home.
- Sing a simple road safety song like "Stop, Look, and Listen."

#### **How to Assess Children's Understanding of Road Rules?**

- Ask children to explain one road rule they have learned.
- Monitor participation in activities.
- Use a short quiz with picture questions (e.g., "What does the red light mean?").
